Keep behind the prop!!

We all know the old rule – stay behind a spinning prop, but I had cause to be thankful I always do this when launching Mels model at Cottenham the other day.



I was just about to hand launch it after Mel opened the throttle when one blade came loose, the whole model vibrated and the motor and remaining prop flew off the model and landed in front of the aircraft.



The damage caused by the vibration shook the nose of the model to pieces!!



One prop blade embedded itself up to the root in the ground!!

So, even with electric models (or perhaps especially with electric) always keep behind the spinning prop.

Hughs Avro Baby looked marvellous but was quite a difficult model to trim




Terry Browns pusher canard flew well in small circles. He said it could be flown in a lighthouse

Weight limits for indoor RC

After a recent incident, we have changed the weight limits for indoor RC model flying and plan to have more "RC only" events in the big Sports Hall.


Basically we have reduced the weight limit for RC models at the mixed FF and RC events in the Sports Hall from 130g to 80g as this is mainly a FF event with smaller RC models flying at one end. 80g is actually still quite a large model in fact!!

The limit for the 30 minute slots in the gym remains at 130g which again is pretty big, but the FF models are grounded during that time.

The limit for the monthly RC only sessions in the Sports Hall has been raised to 200g with a proviso that larger models can be flown subject to consensus on the day and everyone keeping a sharp eye out!!
