## John Wynns notes about the early days of the Cooke Cup

This was the first cup that the club had. It was given by Mrs Cook who was a teacher at the college when I was there. She only taught girls and I'm sure it was for shorthand and Typing. She lived in Impington Lane and was friendly with Ray and other members of the club. The reference to the Reverend was that the Rev. Hunter was the vicar of Impington at the time and he was her friend, and came up to the club occasionally. He did not give the trophy. I think he was an Aussie, and some of our members at the time were church goers as was Mrs Cook. The trophy was originally given for the whole spectrum of aeromodelling and was done on a points basis throughout the year. These competitions were for the following.

Indoor round the pole rubber duration.

Free flight outdoors power duration to the SMAE rules as were the following Free flight glider duration

Free flight Rubber duration

Free flight Jetex duration

Control line A Team racers

Control line Combat

Control line Stunt

Obviously not everyone took part in all competitions but the points of 3, 2 and 1 were awarded in each case for the first three places. The format got changed over the years to the present award for the overall outdoor FF winner.
